FROM POPE BENEDICT ON 'HAIL, FULL OF GRACE' 'All generations will call me blessed'. We call Mary blessed with words woven together from the angelic salutation and Elizabeth's greeting – that is, with words not of human invention. The Evangelist tells us, in fact, that Elizabeth uttered her greeting filled with the Holy Spirit. 'Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb: these are the words of Elizabeth which we repeat after her. Blessed are you – God's promise to Abraham resounds once more at the beginning of the New Covenant: 'You will be a blessing ... and by you all the families of the earth will bless themselves' (Gen 12.2-3).
